
Last week we had our schools External Review. For two days' staff, students and parents/carers including Governing Council members, had the opportunity to discuss various features of the school with review officers. As well, review officers spent a considerable amount of time with staff and students and observing in classrooms. One of the main goals of the review officers is to look for evidence of progress based on the recommendations of the previous 2015 review, as well as looking at current improvement planning and teaching and learning practices to improve student learning outcomes. The review was a positive experience providing us with three clear recommendations moving forward. These recommendations align well to our current site improvement strategies. The review officers stated:

There is a clear willingness by staff to build their capacity to provide quality learning for their students. Students are engaged in their learning and they demonstrated a clear understanding of the expectations of themselves as learners. Value has been placed on the clarity and focus of the school improvement priorities and the clear expectations of implementation.

Our next External Review will be in three years. Thank you to the parents and Governing Council members who gave up their time to be part of the process.

Thank you to all our students for participating in the many tests required in term 3. Our 3-7 students had to complete PAT Reading and Maths as well as Yr 4-7 completing the departments Wellbeing survey. Yr 1 students had the Phonics Screen check, with year 2 students also being retested. We had a catch-up session on Thursday this week for those students who have been away and appreciate that some students needed to complete two assessments on one day which can be difficult. Our term 3 pupil free day will be spend unpacking the PAT data and other data sets to measure growth or otherwise. This will inform our improvement priorities for 2021.

MATERIALS & SERVICES CHARGE 2020

Thank you to those families that have paid the Materials & Services Charge of \$294 for 2020. Final Notices have now been sent out for overdue Materials & Service Charges. The Materials and Services Charge needs to be paid to avoid debt recovery action by Department for Education. Applications for School Card assistance are still able to be made, please apply online at: **sa.gov.au/education/schoolcard**. Please contact the Front Office if you require any assistance.

MATERIALS AND SERVICES CHARGES 2021

A copy of the proposed Materials and Services Charges for 2021 is included in this Newsletter. The 2021 Materials and Services Charges will be discussed and approved at our next Governing Council meeting, Tuesday 27th October 2020 at 7:00pm at Angaston Primary School. If you would like to be a part of this discussion or have any concerns about our charges, please attend this meeting.

Alternatively, if you are unable to attend this meeting, you can express your views in writing to the Chairperson of the Governing Council prior to the meeting.

There has been a new 'Education and Children's Services Act 2019' implemented and under this Act a Voluntary/Non-Legal amount can no longer be invoiced on the Materials and Services Charges. For example, our M&S Charges for 2020 are \$244 with a \$50 Voluntary/Non Legal amount. Non Legal meaning if fees are not paid and debt collection is necessary we can only recover the legal amount of \$244. This means for 2021 we can set our fees at the prescribed sum of \$246(with no \$50 voluntary /Non-Legal amount) or we can choose to set the fees at a higher amount but this would involve a lengthy polling process. At a recent Governing Council meeting it was determined by members to set the amount at \$246 for 2021, due to the current COVID financial impact. If the M&S Charges are to be increased above the Prescribed Sum of \$246, the process includes a Poll(vote) and if the majority agree the fees are increased according to the amount polled. The new invoiced amount is then 'legally recoverable' and no longer voluntary and must be paid to avoid Debt Collection, whereas previously the voluntary amount is non-legal and entirely up to the Parent/Caregiver as to whether they wish to pay this amount. The Governing Council decided unanimously that they were not comfortable with polling and increasing the Legal amount of fees above \$246 for 2020, This option will be reviewed next year in regards to 2022.
